CONTROVERSY OF THE CROSS

(From the book, "Our Daily Bread")

The message of the cross is . . . the power of God

1 Corinthians 1:18

A case before the Supreme Court focused on whether a religious symbol, specifically, a cross, should be allowed on public land. Mark Sherman, writing for the Associated Press, said although the cross in question was erected in 1934 as a memorial to soldiers who died in World War I, one veterans' group that opposed it called the cross "a powerful Christian symbol", and "not a symbol of any other religion."

The cross has always been controversial. In the first century, the Apostle Paul, said that Christ sent him "to preach the gospel, not with wisdom or words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of no effect. For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us that are being saved, it is the power of God. (1 Corinthians 1:17-18). As followers of Christ, we see the cross as more than a powerful Christian symbol. It is the evidence of God's power to free us from the tyranny of our sin.

In a diverse and pluralistic society, the controversy over religious symbols will continue. Whether the cross can be displayed on public property will likely be determined by the courts. But displaying, the power of the cross through our lives will be decided in our hearts. Christ takes each sin, each pain, each loss,
And by the power of His cross,
Transforms our brokenness and shame
So that our lives exalt His name.

Nothing speaks more clearly of God's love than the cross.



What Do They Mean

In the Episcopal Church there are many specific terms. The **thingamajig** that the ushers carry to the altar and give the acolytes has a name as does the **pretty cover on the altar** or the **rope** around the acolyte's waist. Here is a list of terms in ordinary use in the Episcopal Church. Each month, new terms will be presented. The list is neither exhaustive nor definitive. See how many of these words you know.

Apostle Creed: the ancient baptismal confession of the Church

Ascension Day: the day marking the ascension of Christ into heaven

Ash Wednesday: the first day of Lent, so called from the ancient practice of placing ashes on the forehead as a reminder of man's mortal nature

Aumbry: a cupboard or recess in the sanctuary in which the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. It is marked by a candle which burns day and night. At St. Mary's the aumbry is called "The Bird House".

Baptismal Font: a large bowl or receptacle which contains the water used in Holy Baptism
