## Treats for Teachers, Snacks for Staff

The teachers and staff at West Columbia Elementary will spend countless days and hours preparing for the new school year and the students they will inspire. St. Mary's wants to show our appreciation for all they do by providing snacks for their classroom workday. On August 20th, teachers and staff will be working at the school, so treats they can eat on the run or during a quick break would be wonderful. Individually wrapped cookies, nuts, small candies (chocolate or hard), chips, crackers, granola bars, etc. are needed. We are not providing a meal, just something that will satisfy that sweet tooth or crunch craze and will be available all day. If you would like to provide something, bring it to the church between now and Monday, August 19th. Monetary donations can also be made and will be used to purchase additional snacks. The goodies will be delivered to West Columbia Elementary in the morning of Tuesday, August 20th.

## School Supplies Drive

Our annual school drive has begun. Columbia Elementary asks that we only get the following items:

## Christian Formation

Now that summer vacations are almost over and our traveling parishioners are headed back to St. Mary's, we are ready for Christian Formation to begin. The first Sunday morning programs for all ages will be September 8th after Hospitality. The Wednesday evening Christian Formation will begin on September 11th. Stay tuned for more details about all the programs.

The beginning of the Wednesday evening Christian Formation also means the need for simple meals for our children. Once again, there will be a sign-up sheet in the Parish Hall for those who can provide food. The meals do not need to be elaborate. Hotdogs, sandwiches, chicken nuggets, pizza, and other kid friendly meals would be perfect. We are grateful for this demonstration of love and care for our youth and children.

## Teachers and Aides Needed

As stated in the June edition of The Bells of St. Mary's, our Christian Formation for youth and children is changing. In addition to our Sunday morning program, we will have three groups during our weeknight programs. To continue to meet the standards for Safeguarding God's Children, the week day evening youth group under the direction of Colleen Matocha will need one additional adult aide. We will also need an aide for the Wednesday night Christian Formation to help with the children's classes. Just as we did last year, aides will be assigned for the Sunday Godly Play children's program led by Dani Mikel.

A new program for our intermediate elementary students called Imaginative Prayer will be during the Wednesday evening Christian Formation. To meet the needs of this new program, at least two volunteers are requested to serve as teachers. The program is well planned out, easy to follow, and does not require a lot of prep time. The volunteers can alternate Wednesday evenings. Rev. Sharron will be leading the first few classes, so the volunteers will be able to see how the program is run.

If you are willing to serve as an aide or teacher to help guide our children and youth through their journey to learn about God's love, the meaning of being a Christian, and how to serve God, the church, and the community, please let Dani know. Remember the person who guided and influenced you. You can be that person in the life of our children and youth.
