Update on Peter

This is an email sent by Susan on Thursday, December 1st

Hi All,

Peter has seen his Neurologist (Dr. Lai) and Oncologist (Dr. Heyne) this week after he had an MRI on [Monday](#).

Doctors are pleasantly surprised (shocked) that the tumor is gone. There is still scar tissue damage around the site, but the Neurologist was very optimistic that there would be continued improvement of the Parkinsonism syndrome and the somnolence syndrome, and was impressed with the improvements in walking and balance he saw this week. The last time Dr. Lai saw Peter was after his last Chemo back in June when he was being released from the hospital with oxygen and needing skilled nursing because he couldn't walk without assistance and had suffered lung damage from one of the chemo drugs.

Dr. Lai told him to increase mental and physical activity a little each day. Playing memory games, reading, music, talking to people etc... Also highly recommended the PBS show Sit and Be Fit. We both laughed because I tried to get Peter to do that a few weeks ago and he was less than enthusiastic. I told Dr. Lai if he told him to do it he might, but Peter just tells me no.

So according to Dr. Lai he is to concentrate on getting stronger and stimulating his brain as much as possible in the next 3 to 4 months and thought there is a possibility that he could go back to work if he continued to get stronger and walk and see better.

Peter told me after the Doctor left that this was the first time he felt that all the treatments and pain and suffering might not have been in vain after all. Which made me very happy because he is now highly motivated to do Sit and Be Fit!

As expected the oncologist, Dr. Heyne was more cautiously optimistic but thought if the lesions stay away he could recover and liken it to a stroke type recovery that would take time for full functioning to return.

So Peter is going to try and give it his all in the next few months and we will see how far he can recover. He wants to be back to work by his next Birthday [April 4th, 2017](#).

Peter is through with all Chemo and Radiation treatments. He will just continue to monitor blood counts and symptoms and continue Physical Therapy and Voice Therapy.

The History of Saint Mary's Stained Glass Windows (Part 2)

This information is taken from **A Sermon In Glass** given during the dedication of the windows on Sunday, December 16, 1973.

The Clerestory windows in the chancel above the organ form a colorful pattern symbolizing the changing colors of the liturgical year. They form a harmonizing link to the rest of the church by admitting light from their bright and warm symmetrical patterns.

The Nave Windows – West Side

First Window – The Creating Hand of God
