



Message from the Father Paul

Here is a copy of the letter Father Paul presented to the congregation at the annual meeting.

2021 INTERIM RECTOR'S LETTER

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. And God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. (1 Corinthians 12:12-13, 24-27)

Dear people of St. Mary's,

St. Paul wrote often about the importance of the early Christian communities to gather together to support one another. Staying united together in their worship of God in Christ and in their love and care for one another, was of paramount importance to Paul. Over and over again, he emphasized the importance of unity for the wellbeing and the faithfulness of both the church and its individual members. Paul wrote that without the support of the church community, the temptations and forces of the world would be too much to withstand on one's own. Therefore, tending to the health of the church body is all-important, and his letters go into great detail about how that should be done.

If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.

Christine D. Pohl, professor emeritus of Christian ethics at Asbury Theological Seminary, writes the following in her book about the important traits of healthy congregations:

“The character of our shared life in congregations, communities and families has the power to draw people to the kingdom or to push them away. How we live together is the most persuasive sermon we’ll ever get to preach. While the beauty of loving communities does not replace the importance of the verbal proclamation of the gospel, Jesus explicitly linked the truth of his life and message to our life together.”

As I begin this time of transition with all of you, this is the message that I want us to keep in mind. After almost a year of distancing and masking and staying away, I am sure that many of you are feeling disconnected and separated from each other. Therefore, it is our Community itself, that I want us to find ways to regenerate and nurture together. And I believe that this work of community is too important to wait for the next rector before beginning. Your vestry and I promise to make sure the building and grounds are taken care of and the bills are all paid, but we need every one of you to have a community. As St. Paul said, all members are equally needed to form the Body of Christ. Please resolve to have a regular Sunday practice of tuning us in or showing up in person – we have plenty of room to socially distance if you decide to come. Most importantly, stay in contact with each other and with your church leadership. I will be in West Columbia every Tuesday from 8:30 to 5:00, and my primary purpose is to connect with the Body of St. Mary’s and to help you reconnect with each other, so call or come by. In the meantime, I will be trying to call each of you.

Of course, the other important work of this transition is calling the next rector of St. Mary’s, and we will get started with that work with a visit from the Rev. Kellaura Johnson, Transition Minister for the Diocese of Texas, will be with us on Sunday, February 21, for worship and then to talk to our vestry about the process of the rector search. Rev. Kellaura is a delightful person, and I know you will enjoy her preaching and her message about transition.

My final offering to you this morning is words of encouragement. It is so easy to allow the things of the world to get us down and cause us to forget that God is bigger than our worldly cares and concerns. It is easy to be discouraged and defeated by the pandemic and its horribly negative effect on our way of life. But God calls us to stand above worldly concerns and trust in his love and care for us.

Jesus said, *“Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?”*

Indeed, let us agree to be about our mission of uniting all people into a relationship with God and each other in Christ. Amen.

Burying the Alleluia

As is our custom here at St. Mary’s, we will be Burying the Alleluia at the end of our Sunday service on February 14th. This part of the service is traditionally conducted by the children and youth.

Lent

Lent, the 40 days before Easter excluding Sundays, is the time Christians spend in penitence, prayer, and preparation for the celebration of the glorious resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Lenten Season will begin with the Ash Wednesday service on February 17th at 5:30 p.m.

Because of the somberness of the season of Lent, there will be some notable differences in the Sunday service. The Lenten services will use the Penitential Order and the Decalogue, plus Eucharistic Prayer C and other changes. "Alleluia" will be omitted. The Church has a custom of omitting the "Alleluias" typically proclaimed throughout its liturgy. It generally takes us a few weeks to get that through our system, so no worries if an "Alleluia" slips out now and again!
