The Reverend Sharron Cox is a fifth-generation Texan, born and raised in Texas City. A cradle Episcopalian, she was baptized and confirmed at St. George's Episcopal Church. She received her Bachelor of Science in Sociology and Business from Texas A&M University and was later awarded a Master in Business Administration from the University of Texas at Austin. While she has no confusion about which college sport team to support, Sharron is sympathetic to many college programs. After dabbling in banking and corporate real estate, Sharron spent twenty-two years in healthcare administration in finance and health policy, primarily working on the challenge of the uninsured and under-insured on behalf of various hospitals and other organizations. After years of serving her parish and the Diocese of Texas, Sharron finally gave-in to the "Hound of Heaven" and pursued ordination. She attended seminary at the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee and was awarded a Master in Divinity with honors in May 2014.

Before being called as rector by St. Mary's Episcopal Church in West Columbia, Sharron spent three-and-a-half years as first Curate and then Assistant Rector at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Waco. While there, she coordinated pastoral care and adult Christian formation. Among other projects, Sharron recruited lay leaders to receive training and begin a grief support program. Prior to seminary, Sharron was active in youth ministry over two decades in the Diocese of Texas. She was in the first graduation class of the Formation in Direction (FinD) program, a spiritual director training program within the Diocese of Texas and served as a spiritual director for eleven years, leading workshops, coordinating small groups, and teaching classes in Christian contemplative spirituality. Sharron is keenly interested in the intersection of faith, justice, and mercy through supporting local outreach and global mission work, particularly Amistad Mission in Bolivia, Thistle Farms in Nashville, and Agape International Mission in Cambodia.

Sharron is grateful to God that the unfolding of her life and ministry has brought her to work alongside the people of St. Mary's and the community of West Columbia. She is eager to see what God's transforming love is bringing about in both of these communities.

Unexpressed Gratitude

From the book "Our Daily Bread"

"Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good." Ps. 107:1

The whole reason for saying thanks is to let the giver of the gift know how much you appreciate something. Author G.B. Stern once said "Silent gratitude isn't much use to anyone."

When our son was young, he sometimes needed to be reminded that avoiding eye contact, looking down at his feet, and mumbling some unintelligible words, was not an acceptable "thank you." And, after many years of marriage, my husband and I are still learning that it's important for us to continually express our gratitude to each other. When one of us feels appreciative, we try to verbalize it -- even if we've said it many times before about the same thing. William Arthur Ward said "Feeling gratitude, and not expressing it, is like wrapping a present and not giving it."

Showing our gratitude is obviously important in human relationships, but it's even more essential in our relationship with God. As we think about the many blessings we have received, do we express our thanks to Him throughout the day? And when we think about the amazing gift of His death and resurrection for forgiveness of our sins, do our hearts bubble over with awe and thanksgiving?

Take the reminder of Psalm 107:1 to heart each day: "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good."

What Do They Mean

In the Episcopal Church there are many specific terms. The **thingamajig** that the ushers carry to the altar and give the acolytes has a name as does the **pretty cover on the altar** or the **rope** around the acolyte's waist. Here is a list of terms in ordinary use in the Episcopal Church. Each month, new terms will be presented. The list is neither exhaustive nor definitive. See how many of these words you know.

Holy Communion: also **Holy Eucharist** or the **Lord's Supper:** the Christian sacramental meal, the Eucharist

Confirmation: the sacrament by which those who have been made members, by baptism, of Christ's Mystical Body, the Church, are given the gift of the Holy Ghost through the laying on of hands by the bishop

Congregation: group gathered in a particular church

The Corporal: a square piece of linen that is placed under the chalice for the celebration of the Eucharist
