Out with the old, and in with the new. Hopefully those of us who made New Year's Resolutions haven't drifted away quite yet from all our good intentions for the year ahead. That's something we at St. Mary's are getting use to – change. The parish called me to serve among you as Rector this past year. We re-installed Sunday morning Christian formation as most of you longed for opportunities for learning and growth. We celebrated the lay ministers in our midst. Your presence and participation in this service is important for our parish.

An ancient Greek philosopher said, "Life is change." That may be the case for all of us. If so, that is what we will face in 2019. But I don't want to do it without you! Come be a part of these important times for our community on January 27 and 29!

## Message from Marvin Miller

### PEACE

(From the book "Our Daily Bread")

In the days of Adam and Eve, peace was lost. As soon as they ate the forbidden fruit, and realized their nakedness, they started blaming each other, and introduced conflict to God's peaceful planet. (Genesis 3:12-13). Sadly, all of their descendants, including us, have followed their bad example. We blame others for our own bad choices, and become angry when no one will accept the guilt. Blaming others for our unhappiness breaks apart families, churches, communities, and nations. We can't make peace because we're preoccupied with placing the blame.

Christmas is the season of peace. The Old Testament tells the story of how God set the stage to introduce the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:61). Jesus came to break the cycle of sin and blame by making peace for us with God "through the blood of His cross" (Colossians 1:20). Instead of blaming us for all the trouble we cause, He bore the blame for all of us. He now is recruiting followers who, having received His forgiveness, want others to receive it as well.

When we accept forgiveness from God, we lose our desire to withhold it from others. We can both give and receive the gift of peace this Christmas.

At Christmas we celebrate

## News from the Vestry

The vestry met Monday, December 17, 2018

***Rector Report: The Reverend Sharron Cox***

Rev. Sharron discussed her visit with JoAnn Saylor, Canon for Mission Amplification for the Diocese of Texas, and conversation with Mary McGregor, former Canon and present consultant to the diocese. She also presented two people who had agreed to be delegates to the Diocesan Council where a new Bishop will be elected.

***Senior Warden's Report: Karen Logue***

Karen will begin to develop a new Greeters' Ministry after Christmas.

***Junior Warden's Report: Andrea Anderson***

Andrea reported that she was unable to get recommendations and prices for repairs to the parking lot. The matter will be pursued in 2019.

#### *Financial Report: Dani Mikel*

Dani gave the final report on the 2019 Stewardship Campaign pledges. The number of pledges increased 58% and the amount pledged increased 76%. Rev. Sharron and Dani presented the proposed 2019 budget. After discussion and adjustments, the vestry developed a draft budget which will be finalized at the January vestry meeting.

#### Discipleship Report

The Christmas Eve service and Epiphany's Feast of Lights were discussed. Rev. Sharron presented the date of her installation ceremony which will be officiated by Bishop Andy Doyle. Rev. Sharron presented her plans for the adult spring semester class which will focus on discipleship.

#### Mission Report

St. Mary's new Wellness Ministry will be hosting yoga classes in the Parish Hall beginning Thursday, January 3rd at 10:00.
