Who will Serve?



There are so many ways to serve at St. Mary's. Two new opportunities are available, serving on the vestry and being a delegate to the Diocesan Council.

Charlotte Blount's and Marvin Miller 's terms on the vestry have expired and new vestry members are being sought. Although, we have for several years had a vestry with three members, we can have more. The vestry meets at least once a month and works together to support the congregation, make financial decisions based on the approved budget, develop ideas to promote St. Mary's and her mission, and listen to the parishioners' suggestions.

The Diocesan Council is the annual business meeting of the Diocese consisting of delegates from all congregations, college ministries, clergy, and lay heads of congregations. St. Mary's can have up to four delegates representing her at the Diocesan Council. Because of COVID19, the Diocesan Council will be virtual on Friday, February 26th and Saturday, February 27th, so instead of traveling the delegates get to stay home.

Before thinking you can't serve, think about all you have to offer and pray for guidance to see if one of these positions is right for you. If you are interested, call the office so your name can be presented at the annual meeting. Those who indicated on their pledge card an interest in the vestry or Diocesan Council have been included on the list to be presented.
