## **The History of Saint Mary's Stained Glass Windows (Part 1)**

This information is taken from **A Sermon In Glass** given during the dedication of the windows on Sunday, December 16, 1973.

St. Mary's Church today dedicates a truly outstanding work of art in the form of seventeen new windows in the nave and chancel areas of the church.

These windows, called faceted stained glass, are made of one-inch thick pieces of glass set in an epoxy matrix, a style which makes them extremely durable. The jewel-like colors of these windows give the church a beautiful setting in which to worship---to hear God's Word, to celebrate His sacraments, and to offer his praises.

The Nave windows depict a theme of the history of salvation starting with God's activity in the creation of the universe through to the consummation at the end of time. Each window is a perfect vignette of an important episode in this history. The windows on the west or Epistle side of the church deal with God's activity in regards to the Hebrew people, the historical drama set forth in the Old Testament. Windows on the east or Gospel side reach back through the Christian ages that focus especially on the coming of Jesus, centered in His life, death, and resurrection, and the church today.
